SEN Register

The SEN register is a school record that lists students who have special educational needs (SEN). The register helps us ensure that students receive the right support that may be additional to or different from other children who are not on the register.

Often, a child may be put on the SEN register in primary school if they have a need that requires special educational provision. This could be due to a range of needs. However, a child with a diagnosis doesn't necessarily need to be on the SEN register if their needs can be met without additional provision. Children who are not on the SEN register receive learning support through the school's educational provision.

A child may be removed from the SEN register if they make progress in response to the school's special educational provision but remain on the "SEN aware" list, where they are checked on periodically.

If you feel that your child no longer needs to be on the full SEN register and may be better suited on the "SEN aware" list, please email Mr Topley for a discussion around next steps (<u>r.topley@thebolsoverschool.org.uk</u>)










A spotlight on Dyspraxia:
