## **JARGON BUSTER**

Like many things in life, the area of SEND is filled with acronyms and jargon. This section aims to help you understand some of these tricky terms.

SEND – Special educational needs and disabilities

EHCP – education and healthcare plan

SEN Register – a register of students in school who have a condition that may impact their learning

SENDCO – the special educational needs and disabilities coordinator who is the point of contact in school who oversees the SEN register

ADHD – attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder. A neuropathic disorder characterised by hyperactive or inattentive behaviours (or a combination of both)

ASC – autistic spectrum condition. Individuals perceive and understand the world around them differently

PDA – pathological demand avoidance, characterised by refusal to comply with requests or expectations.

SEMH – social, emotional and mental health. Individuals who have difficulty managing their emotions and behaviours

Cognition and learning – the process of acquiring knowledge and skills which may be difficult for some children










## A spotlight on ADHD:
