SEND A Review of the Term

Since September, the SEND term has been working hard to welcome our new Y7 cohort and allow them time to settle in. We have also been working on a number of projects to ensure our provision for SEND students is second to none.

In September, we opened the revamped hive, with a dedicated sensory room and a larger, safer space for all of our SEND students. These improved facilities have been greatly received by all of our students, who are learning how to co-regulate with the help of our new inclusion officer, Mrs Milner. Whilst in the hive, they are developing an understanding of their emotional state and the strategies needed to improve their well-being and state of mind.

Throughout the term our team of TAs, driven on by Mrs Lucas have been working hard on fundraising for our sensory garden. The garden is starting to take shape, helped by a donation of over 100 hedgerow saplings from the Woodland trust and a new outbuilding very kindly supplied and built by Bolsover Sheds and Fencing. This multi-sensory outdoor space will support generations of students for many years to come.



Understanding the 4 Broad Areas of Need in SEND

Communication and Interaction

Difficulties with speech, language, and understanding or using social communication.

- Struggles to express themselves clearly or understand instructions
- Limited vocabulary or unclear speech
- Finds it hard to join conversations or play with others
- May avoid eye contact or misunderstand jokes and social cues

Cognition and Learning

Challenges with learning, thinking, and remembering information.

- Learns more slowly than peers
- Difficulty remembering what was taught yesterday
- Struggles with reading, writing, or maths despite effort
- Needs lots of repetition and extra time to complete tasks

Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH)

Difficulties with managing emotions, behaviour, or mental health.

- Frequent anxiety, sadness, or anger
- Finds it hard to make or keep friends
- Withdraws from others or becomes very clingy
- Displays challenging behaviour at home or school

Sensory and/or Physical Needs

Needs related to vision, hearing, movement, or sensory processing.

- Has hearing or vision difficulties
- Struggles with coordination (e.g., catching a ball, handwriting)
- Sensitive to sounds, lights, textures, or crowds
- Tires easily or needs special equipment to move around
